A Piece of Milton History *Milton and the national motto*

In God We Trust was coined by James Pollock, who was from Milton and served as a Pennsylvania govenor from 1855 to 1858. He died in 1890 and is buried in the Milton cemetery.

In 1868 Pollock had “In God We Trust” placed on currency as he was serving as director of the U.S. Mint while serving under President Abraham Lincoln. ☀

With very little effort, I was able to learn about a wide variety of opportunities. I began by volunteering at the Evangelical Community Hospital gift shop. There are over 400 volunteers at Evan performing a wide variety of functions geared towards their abilities and interests. Volunteers man the gift shop, reception desks, assist in the ER, help patients who have mobility issues, champion the NODA (No One Dies Alone) program, and much more. Through the Evan Volunteer Program I was introduced to The Hospital Auxiliary. This organization of 120+ individuals, manages a number of fundraising activities including Lights of Love, Bake Sales, Candy Sales, Yard Sales, Fashion Shows, Holiday Boutiques and A Night At The Cinema. Proceeds from these events go to directly support Hospital programs such as Hospice, The Family Place, The Community Health Center and the Thyra M. Humphreys Center For Breast Health. The group also knits baby blankets and sews Christmas stockings among other projects. I am proud to be President of The Auxiliary for the 2012 – 2014 term.

The opening of the new Milton Library presented another opportunity for volunteering by becoming A Friend Of The Library. Here again there are a variety of opportunities including helping with fundraisers and assisting at the library reception desk. And, if you are a cinema buff, you can volunteer to help at the concession stand at The Campus Theatre. Volunteers not only help with controlling costs for the theatre, as a side benefit they get to watch the movie for free.

Volunteering has been a wonderful experience for me. It has helped me to settle into a new community more easily, afforded me the opportunity to meet a wide variety of new people and to learn new things. Most importantly, it has allowed me to find a way to give back to my community and to help others. I only wish I had started earlier. ☺



